

Practice writing logical consequences

Keep the 4 Rs (Respectful, Reasonable, Related, Responsible) in mind as you practice writing logical consequences for the following three examples of mistaken behavior. Use the blank boxes in the chart to record a few common behaviors you have recently witnessed, and devise logical consequences for each. (The logical consequences may be different than what actually happened as a consequence.)

Youth's mistaken behavior	Possible logical consequence (Is it respectful, reasonable, related, and responsible? If it is NOT all of these things, rewrite it until it meets all of the criteria.)
Youth runs through the program space and knocks down another youth.	
Youth leaves the program when her parent arrives for pick up, but has not cleaned up her activity.	
Youth spills paint on another child's project.
